NOTICE OF RACE

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*
- 1.2 The prescriptions that may require advance preparation by teams are stated in full below.
The ISSA Procedural Rules and The Supplemental Rules of the PCISA
- 1.3 Class rules requiring CFJ or Club 420 class membership shall not apply.
- 1.4 All boats must use sails provided by HYSA and enter in any designated round robin rotation.

2. ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Under ISAF Rule 20.3 this is a no advertising event, except that
- 2.2 Under ISAF Rule 20.4.1 '...The Organizing Authority or an event has the right to make use of the following spaces according to the following terms: ...' under this rule boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3. ELIGIBILITY & ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open as follows: Qualifying Schools from every member District are eligible for this event. A school qualifies when they meet ISSA Rule 1. ELIGIBILITY
- 3.2 Eligible schools enter by completing the entry form and sending it, together with the required fee, to:

- 3.3 All entries must be received by 2100 hours Thursday 15 November, 2012. Exceptions may be made at the discretion of HYSA.
- 3.4 Liability and medical release forms will be required at the time of registration.
- 3.5 Schools are limited to one Team. The regatta has 12 boats, to support 12 Teams.
- 3.6 Availability is on a first come first served basis.
- 3.7 Teams will consist of 4 or more sailors. Schools sending less than 4 sailors will be given additional sailors. Schools with two sailors may choose the A or B Division and their team will be supplemented with local sailors in the alternate division (or provided with two crew, should they have two skippers).
- 3.8 Teams unable to compete must notify HYSA C/O Katie Merrill as soon as possible.

4. SAFETY & LIFEJACKETS

- 4.1 Lifejackets meeting U.S. Coast Guard regulations for Personal Floatation Devices (PFDs) Type III shall be worn. Non U.S. Coast Guard certified PFDs will not be allowed.

5. FEES

Required fees are per team. Additional teams pay all fees and complete separate entry forms.

Charter Fee	\$100.00
Damage Deposit	\$250.00 (Make this a separate check to be returned at end of regatta if no damage)

6. FLEET

- 5.1 The regatta will consist of one Fleet.
- 5.2 Each team will sail one boat and will rotate boats and crews every second race. Modifying the ISSA rules this is a two division event. There will be an A and B Division. The boats will be rotated every 2nd race. The rotation will start with the A Division. After two races the B Division will rotate into the boats and so on through the rotation schedule. Sunday the rotation schedule will begin where left off on Saturday.

7. SCHEDULE

- 7.1 Practice Session 1300 – 1500 Friday 23 November, 2012
7.2 Registration & Inspection 0830 – 0930 Saturday 24 November, 2012
7.2 Skippers Meeting 0930 – 1000 Saturday 24 November, 2012
7.3 Dates of & Racing Saturday 24 & Sunday 25 November, 2012
7.4 Number of races is expected to be approximately 4-6 races per day, with a minimum of 3 races that must be completed to constitute a series.
7.5 The scheduled time for the first race each day is:
First Race Start Time 1100
No race will start after 1600 Saturday 24 November, 2012
No race will start after 1500 Sunday 25 November, 2012

8. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The Sailing Instructions will be available after 0830 on Saturday 24 November, 2012 at registration.

9. SCORING

9.1 The regatta will be scored in accordance with Official Procedural Rules for Interscholastic Sailing Competition.

10. VENUE

- 10.1 The host club will be Kaneohe Yacht Club.
10.2 The venue will be the waters of Kaneohe Bay directly to the west of the yacht club outside the coral patches that line the entrances to the harbor.
10.3 Practice will be at Kaneohe Yacht Club. Please let us know if you intend to practice.

11. THE COURSES

Courses will be Windward Leeward variations detailed in an attachment to the Sailing Instructions.

12. PRIZES

- 12.1 Prizes will be given at the end of the regatta for Series Scores for 1st – 3rd Places
12.2 Additional fun awards may be awarded

13. DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY & MEDICAL RELEASE FORMS

13.1 Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during or after the regatta.
