NOTICE OF RACE

The Interscholastic Sailing Association is the organizing authority and Chicago Yacht Club is the host.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 The Official Procedural Rules for Interscholastic Sailing Competition will apply.
- 1.3 The Interscholastic National Championship General Conditions will apply.
- 1.4 The Interscholastic Sailing Association Conditions for ISSA Mallory Doublehanded National Championship will apply.
- 1.5 The following US Sailing Prescriptions will not apply: 60, 63.2, and 63.4.
- 1.6 Appendix P and procedural rule 14(c) will apply.

2 ELIGIBILITY

Selection of competing schools will be by district elimination. The regatta is limited to twenty (20) teams and district allocations will be determined by the ISSA board of directors. Schools may contact their district directors to receive details about district-level elimination events.

3 ENTRY

- 3.1 An eligible team may enter the regatta by completing the entry form and submitting the entry fee no later than the entry deadline. The entry form is on-line at www.chicagoyachtclub.org.
- 3.2 The entry deadline is May 1, 2013.
- 3.3 Completed team roster, medical, and liability forms shall be submitted to the regatta contact no later than during registration, May 10, 2013.
- 3.4 A team that withdraws from the regatta after the entry deadline or fails to compete at the event will forfeit its entry fee, unless replaced by another team.

4 FEES

- 4.1 The entry fee is \$500 per team, which includes dinner on Friday evening, breakfast and lunch on Saturday and Sunday, and heavy appetizers at the awards ceremony on Sunday afternoon.
- 4.2 Each team must submit a refundable boat damage deposit of \$300 no later than May 1, 2013. In the event of damage that cannot be attributed to a specific team, repair costs will be allocated evenly to all the teams competing.
- 4.3 Make checks payable to Chicago Yacht Club or submit credit card information during online registration.

5 BOATS

The Chicago Yacht Club will provide twenty (20) Collegiate 420s. Boats shall be sailed as provided. No other boats may be used in the regatta.

6 RACING AREA

The race area will be in either the open waters of Lake Michigan east of Belmont Harbor or in Belmont Harbor. The race area selection will be made by the principal race officer and the regatta organizer.

7 SCHEDULE

Friday, May 10

1300-1700 - Registration, practice

Saturday, May 11

0800 – Registration, breakfast, rigging of boats

0815 – Competitor meeting. All competitors shall attend the competitor meeting.

0945 – First warning. Races will continue throughout the day

Sunday, May 12

0800 – Breakfast, rigging of boats

0830 – Competitor meeting -All competitors shall attend the competitor meeting.

0945 – Warning signal for first race

1530 – No race will start after this time

8 RACING AREA

The race area will be either in the open waters of Lake Michigan east of Belmont Harbor or in Belmont Harbor.

9 COACHING

Coaching may take place on the anchored vessel *Carrier V*.

10 PRIZES

10.1 Prizes will be awarded to schools placing 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the regatta. The top school will have its name engraved on the perpetual Mallory trophy.

10.2 Prizes will also be awarded to the first place skipper and crew in A and B divisions.

11 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race.

The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
